GHCA Programs/Services

Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

provides nutrition education and special foods to women who are pregnant, breastfeeding or who have recently had a baby and/or have infants and children including foster children. There are WIC offices in Wisner, Norfolk and South Sioux City. The program also provides monthly and bi-monthly clinics in Neligh, Tekamah, Hartington, West Point, Wisner, Wakefield, Creighton, Madison, Pender, Wayne, and Osmond.

Commodity Supplemental Food

Program (CSFP) provides nutrition education and foods to infants, children, the elderly and pregnant or postpartum women. Our four distribution sites are located in South Sioux City, Norfolk, Creighton and Wisner.

Operation Great Start provides infant care home visitation, teen parent education and pre and inter-conception care. The program is at no cost to families residing in the service area's of Franciscan Care Services/St. Francis Memorial Hospital in West Point and Faith Regional Health Services in Norfolk.

The Immunization Program

provides vaccines to adults and children age 18 and under, following the recommended schedule by Nebraska Health and Human Services and the Center for Disease Control. Immunizations are given by a licensed Nurse and a Physician is on call for each clinic. Vaccines available at each of the public sites include: Influenza, IPV, Dtap, Td, MMR, HiB, Hepatitis B, HPV, Meningococcal, Varicella, Rotovirus and PCV7. No child is denied immunizations for inability to pay. Please call for information on adult vaccines and cost.

Head Start is a comprehensive preschool program, providing children and their families with educational, social, medical and nutritional services. Our Head Start Centers are located in:

Operation Building Blocks are home visitation programs for families with children in Burt, Cedar, Cuming, Dixon, Madison, Stanton, Thurston and Wayne and counties. The goals of these programs are: improvement of parenting skills, awareness of the importance of social-emotional and cognitive development, and the benefits of good physical and mental health.

Family Services promotes client self-sufficiency through a variety of programs including food pantries, rent, utilities and other emergency assistance, tax filing assistance, budgeting, tax counseling, homeless prevention assistance, case management and child safety seat program. Satellite offices are located in Creighton, Norfolk, Wayne, Fremont, Blair and South Sioux City.

S.U.P.E.R. (Selecting Ultra-healthy Practices for Effective Results) clinics offer a variety of health services in a one-stop-shop approach.

Weatherization helps alleviate the ever increasing costs of heating and cooling homes of Nebraska's low income residents. It is a long term solution to the high costs of heating consumption, both to individuals and the environment. Eligible low income participants include renters, as well as, homeowners.

Weatherization Expansion Project

Families needing repairs to qualify for the Weatherization Program will be served by Weatherization Expansion Project so they can receive weatherization services. Repairs to homes may include: roof and foundation repair.

Early Development Network Services

Coordination helps families with infants or children 0-3 who have a disability and who qualify for special education in the Norfolk Public School System.
